

1953 - Bomb hits on beach 110° T, distance 1,600 yards.  
1955 - Antiaircraft fire on Bogie at 130° T, distance 3,000 yards.  
Bogie out of range of fire.  
2030 - Bogies closing in on airfield 7 to 14 miles.

15 April 1945.

2056 - Enemy twin engine bombers (Betty) picked up by searchlights and radar controlled shore batteries, bearing 115° T, distance 4 miles.  
2057 - Combined ship antiaircraft took Bogie silhouetted in searchlights under fire, but range too great. String of bombs dropped on beach, as Betty moved out of sight.  
2106 - 2140 - Enemy bomber (Betty) bearing 030° T, distance 4 miles, passed in and out of sight. Unable to reach it with AA fire.  
2225 - Radar screen reported all clear, no Bogies in area.

16 April 1945.

0215 - 0658 - Radar guard station reported Bogies throughout the area, distance 8 to 30 miles.

17 April 1945.

0245 - 0250 - Radar contacts with various Bogies, none closer than 4 miles.

20 April 1945.

2125 - Bogie radar contact at 175° T, distance 14 miles.  
2132 - Commenced fire on Bogie bearing 220° T. Bogie escaped out of range.  
2238 - Bomb hits scored on beach by enemy high altitude bombers in sector bearing 010° to 060° T, distance 3,000 yards.

21 April 1945.

2000 - 2240 - Air alert with Bogies opening and closing in area from 4 to 25 miles distant. Shore batteries opened fire on high flying planes, but no hits scored.

22 April 1945.

0059 - 0129 - Bogie followed in by radar 20 miles from Zampa Ido Ki (Pt. Bolo) until reported over Yontan Airfield. Not visible by eye.

23 - 25 April 1945.

Continued servicing ships. No enemy aircraft contacts in vicinity.

26 April 1945.

0225 - 0401 - Bogies reported in various sectors from 3 to 15 miles distant. None visible, although shore batteries fired on target bearing 260° T.

27 April 1945.

2020 - 2250 - Numerous radar contacts on high flying Bogies. Bogies in and out of area picked up by searchlights and radar controlled guns, but out of range.  
2230 - Ship and shore batteries commenced firing on enemy plane (Zeke) bearing 320° T, at 5,000 feet, which passed out of sight in smoke screen.

28 April 1945.

0000 - At general quarters.  
0308 - Commenced firing on enemy aircraft bearing 040° T, distance 1,000 yards.  
0319 - Enemy bomber (Sally) picked up by searchlights bearing 350° T, distance 3,000 yards. Out of range of combined AA fire.  
0324 - Zeke at 110° T, distance 2,500 yards placed under AA fire while in view momentarily as smoke screen lifted.  
1500 - Began replacing expended provisions from U.S.S. KA-124.  
2137 - At alert for rest of night under cover of excellent fog screen with Bogies in anchorage vicinity.

29 April 1945.

0155 - 0515 - At alert on general quarters stations. Bogies in area but none visible under smoke screen. Bomb hits scored on beach, believed to be Yontan Airfield.
