

2110 - 2357 - Numerous outlying radar enemy aircraft contacts.

30 April 1945.

0215 - Radar contacts momentarily.

4 May 1945.

0200 - All hands at battle stations. Bogie raid reported by radar guard ship bearing 090° T, 19 miles from Pt. Bolo (Zampa Misaki).

0250 - Shore batteries opened fire for period of one minute.

0258 - Ship and shore batteries opened fire on Bogie after it dropped two bombs on Yontan Airfield, bearing 020° T, distance 4,000 yards.

0320 - Ship and shore guns firing on Bogie bearing 075° T, distance 4,000 yards.

0342 - Shore batteries firing on Bogie. No hits scored by AA as far as could be determined.

0350 - Guard stations report area clear of all Bogie contacts - secured from battle stations.

2000 - Receiving aboard GSK and Ship's Store provisions from U.S.S. CASTOR (AKS-2).

6 May 1945.

0210 - Once again at battle stations.

0222 - Ship and shore batteries firing on Bogie passing in from 160° T, distance 5,000 yards to 150° T, distance 10,000 yards - plane having dropped several bombs.

0316 - Shore radar controlled guns firing - target not visible.

0456 - All Bogies clear of area.

7 May 1945.

0210 - Went to general quarters with numerous raids closing.

0232 - One plane of Bogie raid #2 crashed one mile from Pt. Bolo.

0249 - Bogie raid #4 closed to 060° T, 12 miles from Pt. Bolo.

0250 - Raid #4 now at 045° T, distance 10 miles.

0307 - Bogie raid #2 bearing 050° T, distance 7 miles.

0309 - Bogies at 050° T, distance 4 miles, opening on course 270° T.

0414 - Bogie bearing 350° T, distance 5 miles.

0425 - Last reported Bogies bearing 080° T, distance 10 miles; closed to six miles and then opened to 12 miles.

0447 - All bogies faded from screen - secured from general quarters.

9 May 1945.

Several conditions of alert participated in during daylight hours, but nothing materialized.

2100 - All hands to battle stations.

2108 - Radar control station reports lone Bogie bearing 130° T, distance 12 miles.

2134 - All clear from enemy air activity.

2155 - at general quarters, with Bogie contacts coming in at distances beyond 40 miles.

2204 - Bogie at 270° T, 10 miles distant.

2205 - All clear - secured from battle stations.

10 May 1945.

0018 - 1442 - This was a morning filled with numerous Bogie contacts in all sectors at distances of from two miles and above. Bogies converged over Pt. Bolo and shore batteries fired for several minutes, but no hits were evident to us.

11 May 1945.

From 0105 to 0510 the condition of general quarters was again set throughout the ship as Bogie reports kept coming in rapid succession from the control station. Bogies showed up in all sectors, but none were within firing range.

1100 - Commenced taking aboard for re-issue 202 tons of fresh and dry provisions from U.S.S. BRIDGE (AF-1).

12 May 1945.

1907 - Various ships in the anchorage and shore batteries commenced firing on four (4) sneak Bogies having all the appearances of friendly
